This Deadly Sex Networking Update webinar will provide Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health or community workers with an update on the latest in HIV and hepatitis C including testing, prevention, treatment and management.

With continually improving treatment options, HIV is now considered a manageable chronic condition requiring lifelong treatment. New hep C treatments offer a shorter duration of therapy, minimal side effects and cure rates greater than 90%. This webinar will support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health workers to confidently discuss key messages around HIV and hep C with clients and community. The content will include the latest information on HIV and hep C testing, prevention, treatment and management.
