

WHAT IS A BURSARY?

A bursary is an amount of money to help you meet some of the costs of developing yourself through further professional development.. It can be sometimes hard to find the money to attend conferences that will add value to your career, organisation and self development so the bursary can assist with some of those costs.

NATSIHWA is providing up to:

- 25 bursaries for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Student Members
- 75 bursaries for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Full Members assisting to meet the costs of further professional development by attending this years conference.

The Bursary are a one-off payment of \$1,000 which will be paid to the applicant or applicants organisation (whoever is supporting you to attend) and must be used to support the applicant to attend NATSIHWA 10 Year Anniversary Conference

WHO CAN APPLY?

To apply you must be able to meet the following:

- Proof of enrollment for a Student NATSIHWA member who is currently enrolled in an approved Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander primary health care course study either a cert II, cert III, cert IV practice, cert IV care, diploma practice, diploma care or advance diploma care
- Have paid the registration fee to attend the conference

WHAT DOES THE BURSARY COVER?

The bursary is available for self-funding registrants or organisations to put towards travel and accommodation cost expenses for Full Members or Student Members in commute to and from Alice Springs for NATSIHWA 10 Year Anniversary Conference held in October 2019
