Job Description

About the role:

The Community Engagement Support Worker is responsible for implementing a range of activities which link service supports to the needs of Stolen Generation survivors, their families, and descendants. This role will include the ability to build and maintain relationships with a wide range of stakeholders in a culturally appropriate manner whilst working in partnership with other key team members and projects that will include but not limited to transport to and from appointments and social activities.

The right candidate will have sound knowledge or experience of the impacts of trans-generational trauma experienced by Stolen Generations survivors and their families, and the ability to work in a trauma-informed environment.



Selection Criteria

- Demonstrated understanding of the history of the NSW Stolen Generation
- Demonstrated experience in the development, implementation, and delivery of services for Aboriginal people, families, and communities
- Proven ability working with planning and coordination of programs and their activities including monitor implementation of programs policies and practices
- Demonstrated ability to develop and maintain quality internal and external partnerships and networks with key stakeholders including government departments, community agencies, and the ability to engage and influence a variety of stakeholders to work together to achieve positive outcomes
- Experience in participating as part of a multi-disciplinary team in the resolution of complex issues. Proven ability to operate in a diverse work environment with people from a variety of levels and disciplines.
- Demonstrated ability to work autonomously whilst maintaining accountability. Experience in keeping programs on schedule, within stated budgets and functioning smoothly. Demonstrated organisational and time management skills to ensure work is prioritised appropriately and completed in a timely manner.
- Demonstrated ability to development and implement of a range of engagement tools and techniques such as community forums and events, workshops, briefings, surveys or community outreach activities, communications platforms, web content, flyers, newsletters, videos, social media content and advertising activities
- Strong IT/computer literacy including a working knowledge of Microsoft Office programs
- Current First Aid Certificate, Working with Children's Check and National Criminal Record Check.
