Am I eligible for a cadetship?

To be considered for a cadetship you must be:

- able to commit to 52 cadet days over a 12 month period of employment, starting 7 February 2022 and finishing 6 February 2023
- enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course at a recognised university, and have completed at least one semester but with two or more semesters to complete (equivalent/min 3 units per semester)
- identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
