Exciting new opportunity to be part of a national implementation project to help Aboriginal women quit smoking

The iSISTAQUIT (implement – Supporting Indigenous Smokers To Assist Quitting) project addresses an issue of utmost importance to public health – tobacco smoking in pregnant Indigenous women. These full-time, fixed term (until 30 June 2022) positions are located at our new centre in Coffs Harbour. Varied levels of travel will be a required for each role to engage, consult and support First Nations People and their services Australia-wide.

POST-DOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOW (4047)

This role is suited to an early/mid-career post-doctoral researcher who is keen to work on the iSISTAQUIT intervention project.

The Post-Doctoral Research Fellow will lead the development and analysis of the iSISTAQUIT project, a social media campaign to raise awareness of smoking among Indigenous women, and analyse three existing strategies for reducing smoking in pregnancy. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are encouraged to apply.

ABORIGINAL RESEARCH ASSISTANT AND CULTURAL ADVISOR (4049)

The successful applicant will help develop and roll-out the iSISTAQUIT training to approximately 20 Aboriginal Medical Services or mainstream services in a number of states.

They will work closely with the Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services sector, as well as consulting with Peak organisations, policy makers and Aboriginal communities. This is an Aboriginal-identified position.

ABORIGINAL PROJECT OFFICER (4050)

The Project Officer will oversee the day-to-day management of iSISTAQUIT under the supervision and direction of the Director. They will provide high level research support and deliver project objectives within agreed scope, cost, time, risk and quality. They will manage internal and external communications, ethics applications, documentation, and reporting for the Department of Health. This is an Aboriginal-identified position.
