Sinead is passionate about providing access to eye care, where she has worked as a volunteer optometrist on a charitable clinic in rural New Zealand and also as part of a sustainability optometry clinic program in Rwanda, East Africa.



Kerry Woods has been working in various roles in Aboriginal health for the past 25 years. She started working from the ground up into management, overseeing staff and implementing and evaluating community health programs. Kerry joined the team in November 2016 and is involved in assisting with the organisation, coordination and delivery of eye clinics to Aboriginal patients provided by Lions Outback Vision. The aim is to support Lions Outback Vision to improve access to eye care for Aboriginal patients through improved access to services, attendance at consultations, pathways to treatment, referrals and follow up care. Kerry liaises closely with the visiting optometry program, outreach ophthalmology services, regional eye health coordinators and support Aboriginal patient's access to Perth based eye clinics. She is often the first point of contact for Indigenous patients who travel to Perth from regional and remote WA.
